"This award validates the work that we do in our school and as a broader organization to break barriers and empower our local community. It represents the countless hours and tireless efforts of our staff, faculty, students, and families as we work collaboratively to promote excellence and high academic achievement," said Tania Diaz, the Vice President and Director of Instruction for Esperanza Academy.

Esperanza Academy Charter School has been serving the young members of its community for 18 years. The school started in the single hallway of a converted warehouse in 2000 and has grown into a multi-school campus. Enrollment has likewise expanded from an original freshmen class of less than 200 to a student body of 1,450 in grades 6 through 12. In 2017, Esperanza Academy began the process of adding a K-5 elementary program.

Diaz attributes Esperanza Academy's outstanding progress over the last several years to their goal of providing students with the tools necessary to become successful and contributing members of society.

"We believe that we can achieve this by providing them with a high quality educational program, a rigorous curriculum, a safe, nurturing environment, and role models who they can aspire to become," Diaz said.

Esperanza Academy expects to continue empowering students towards excellence, increase overall proficiency in ELA, Math, and Science, and exceed the standard for PA Academic Growth in every content area and grade level in the 2018-2019 school year.
