Teatro Esperanza, in collaboration with EnfocArte and The Philadelphia Collective Para el Arte Puertorriqueño, presents the Philadelphia premiere of *Lolita*: a monologue on the life of Lolita Lebrón, written by Waldo Torres, and featuring actor/producer Viviana Torres Mestey. *Lolita* is a dynamic and complex performance that explores how tragedy and idealism led one young woman to participate in an attack on the United States government.

Inspired by the life and work of the nationalist leader, *Lolita* tells Lebrón's story in her own words. After serving her first year in the federal penitentiary at Alderson, West Virginia, Lebrón recounts her participation in a violent attack on the United States Congress in 1954. Through this piece, the fascinating and tumultuous life of Lebrón, who was born in Puerto Rico, is explored poetically and with sensitivity. The performance dives into the origin of Lebrón's deep roots in national identity, feminism, and religion. *Lolita* illuminates intimate facets of Lebrón's life that few knew.

Since 2002, Viviana has been producing plays for various production companies in Puerto Rico and in 2012, she founded EnfocArte, Inc. EnfocArte is a non-profit organization that produces educational projects, theater works, and photography expositions. Through EnfocArte, Ms. Torres Mestey has



produced both commercial plays and educational theater projects for children. Beyond the performing arts, she has produced concerts, art exhibits, and installations. She actively participates in international events representing Puerto Rico. She has presented theater in Spain, Mexico, Cuba, and Colombia. She has also produced various film and television projects. EnfoCarte continues to evolve and innovate under her guidance and inspiration.

Antonio Cabán Vale ("el Topo")

Guitarist, singer, poet, and composer of Puerto Rican folkloric themes. "El Topo" is one of the founders of the "new song" movement (Spanish: nueva canción) of the early 1970s. He has published several highly acclaimed books of poetry and released over twenty albums throughout his 40 year career. El Topo's danza Verde Luz (Green Light) became a popular symbol of national dignity, to the point that it is viewed by many as Puerto Rico's a second national anthem and has been interpreted by singers and musicians the world over.
