Esperanza College of Eastern University seeks individuals to serve in the role of **Adjunct Professor** for several of our academic concentrations:

English - These courses include, but are not limited to, English 101, English 102, and Global Literature curriculum. The curriculum blends ESL and College English, combining the skills in reading, writing and grammar to assure success in students' courses within the college.

English (Spanish Track) - These courses include, but are not limited to, English 101 and English 102. The curriculum is taught predominantly in Spanish where student's reading, writing and grammatical skills in English are strengthened to a mastery level.

Science - These courses include, but are not limited to, Chemistry, Biology, Anatomy and Physiology, and Physical Science.

Math - These courses include, but are not limited to, Math, College Algebra, preCalculus, Calculus and Statistics.

Digital Communication, Media & Technology - These courses include, but are not limited to, Intro to Mass Media, Social Media in Organizations, New Media Networks and Technologies, Web and Mobile Technologies, Digital Storytelling, Media Production, Principles of Design and Production, Writing for Media, and Transmedia Story Structure & Social Change.

Esperanza College is a partnership between Esperanza and Eastern University. The college is in a primarily Latino community in eastern North Philadelphia, just south of US Route 1, the Roosevelt Boulevard. Esperanza College offers a two-year liberal arts education culminating in Associate degrees (Arts, Science, or Applied Science) in Business Administration, Christian Ministry, Community and Human Services, Criminal Justice, Digital Communication, Early Childhood Education, Health Sciences, Math, Medical Assisting, Media and Technology or Natural Sciences.

The successful candidate will have:

- Master's degree from an accredited college or university in a related field of study
- College level instructional experience in a multicultural and urban setting.
