ESPERANZA PARTNERS WITH HABITAT FOR HUMANITY PHILADELPHIA TO BRING HOME REPAIR TRANSFORMATION TO HUNTING PARK COMMUNITY

Support comes as part of Esperanza's Housing and Economic Development Home Repair Program, which helps low-income residents revitalize their neighborhood into a vibrant and safe place to live.

PHILADELPHIA, PA – February 23, 2018. Esperanza will announce a partnership with Habitat for Humanity Philadelphia to bring home repairs to the Hunting Park community in Northeast Philadelphia, a fast-growing neighborhood, quickly establishing itself as a gateway to Latino Philadelphia. With Habitat for Humanity playing the role of general contractor, <u>Esperanza's Housing and Economic Development (EHED)</u>'s new program, the Building Hope Critical Home Repair Initiative will provide low-cost critical home repairs to 20 owner-occupied homes along the North 5th St corridor.

Esperanza is pleased to have PNC Bank sponsor the Home Repair Program, and will invest a total of \$500,000 in the North 5th St. corridor thanks to generous support from FHLB of Pittsburgh.

"We're excited to partner with Habitat for Humanity for the first time to provide our Hunting Park neighbors and homeowners the critical repairs their homes so desperately need," said Rev. Luis Cortés Jr. President, Founder and CEO of Esperanza. "This is an opportunity for our organizations to join our efforts and help more Latino families preserve their current homes."

The Rev. Luis Cortés Jr. will join Corinne O'Connell, Habitat for Humanity Philadelphia Chief Executive Officer, sponsors and funders to make the partnership announcement on Monday, March 5, 2018 at 10:00 a.m. at 4008 N. 5th Street, Philadelphia PA 19140. The event will feature opening remarks by the Rev. Luis Cortés and a testimony by first Home Repair Program resident Angel Colón.

"Habitat and Esperanza make natural partners because we are both in the business of building community. This partnership leverages each organization's strengths with Esperanza's deep roots and investment in Hunting Park, and Habitat's home repair experience. We know we can accomplish more together – and hope this is just the start," said Corinne O'Connell.
